CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS ADULT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

1. GENERAL: The Headquarters (HQS), CACC will host training events for adult members to extend their knowledge of curriculum topics and refresh their training on these topics. Training sessions will be virtual while the Covid Pandemic is still restricting movement and gathering, though later events may be hosted in person when that option becomes available. All CACC adults are encouraged to participate to gain subject expertise and improve their ability to teach the subject matter to our cadets. The purpose of this Circular is to announce the dates and topics to be offered in 2021.

2. PARTICIPATION: These are optional courses that will benefit a commandant or any adult CACC member who trains cadets, either in school or activity situations. They are voluntary activities on the part of the participants, unless approved for pay as professional training by your school or district. Instructors may be paid for their preparation and participation if they're in the CACC pay system.

3. TRAINING DATES and SUBJECTS:

4. DECSRIPTION OF TRAINING:

a. **Success in Virtual Instruction**. An interactive seminar that shares best practices on conducting virtual training, focused on improving CACC training in the virtual arena and sharing ideas on how to improve it, and even how to run your CACC program virtually.

b. **Leadership Conference**: A conference that updates commandants (all CACC adults) on what's new in the California Cadet Corps, reviewing important changes to regulations and activity plans, and presenting information on CACC curriculum subject areas. Conducted twice a year, in the Spring and Fall. The Spring Conference is virtual, lasting half a day. The Fall Conference is (ideally) in-person and includes

coordination for training activities at CSLO and some dissemination of uniform and training items, as possible, from HQ CACC Logistics. The Fall Conference is a 1.5-day conference on a weekend. Both include seminars designed to engage Commandants in improving their ability to run their CACC program and share information on best practices and CACC-related material.

c. **Map Reading**: An interactive seminar covering basics of Map Reading and Land Navigation to both reinforce the basics of the subject for commandants without much of a background in this area plus sharing better ways to teach it so cadets can master this material and use it for amazing training opportunities.

d. **Survival Instructor Training**: Introduces CACC adults to the basic skills necessary to serve as an instructor in the Summer Encampment Survival Training Unit.

e. **Drill and Ceremonies Instruction**: Provides a review of common drill movements for commandants who have little experience in D&C. Focuses on how to instruct drill at the school level and how to use cadets as drill instructors.

f. **First Aid/CPR Instructor Certification**: Red Cross course that certifies instructors to teach the Red Cross First Aid and CPR course, with the ability to issue Red Cross First Aid and CPR Cards to students.

g. **Curriculum Roadshow**: A seminar on how to access and navigate through the CACC Curriculum as described in CR 3. Includes hands-on practicum on developing pacing guides, accessing and using the text, slides, and assessments available to commandants teaching the CACC program. Especially useful for new Commandants.

5. UNIFORM: The uniform for these training events is CMU or ACU (OCP).

6. COST: There is no cost for participation.
