WARNING ORDER 010-2122-007 (Marksmanship Competition)

1) SITUATION:

a) Name of Event/Operation: 2022 CACC Smallbore Marksmanship Competition

b) Dates: 12 February 2022 to 13 February 2022

c) Important Start and End Times:

i) Check-in: 12 February 2022, 0700

ii) Competition Event: 12 February, 0700 to dusk

iii) Award Ceremony: February, 1900

- d) Location: San Luis Obispo Sportsman Association (SLOSA), 3270 Gilardi Rd, San Luis Obispo, CA
- e) Units Participating: Each unit in the California Cadet Corps may sponsor one or more teams to compete at the appropriate (Sr or Jr) level
- f) Participation Requirements: All cadets in a CACC school that allows participation in small-bore marksmanship competitions, and who are in good standing with parental and commandant permission, may attend the event.
- g) Participant must have a signed consent to participate CACC form 37 found on the Cadet Corps web site in the documents tab under forms.
- 2) MISSION: The California Cadet Corps gathers for the Smallbore Marksmanship Competition at the SLOSA on 12 February 2021 to conduct various physically/mentally challenging competitive events in a field setting designed to promote teamwork and marksmanship skills.

3) EXECUTION:

- a) Commander's Intent: A competitive marksmanship event that hearkens to one of the original cornerstone activities of the CACC. Cadets will be offered the opportunity to compete in a safe and rewarding skill-set that allows for individual accomplishment through the contribution to the team effort. Cadets will have imparted upon them a "safety always" approach to responsible firearm handling through the mentorship of experienced and qualified military and adult staff.
- b) Concept of Operations: The Smallbore Marksmanship Competition will focus on marksmanship principles and safety and be conducted IAW Cadet Regulation 3-17 and NRA Rules
- c) Goals:
 - i) Goal 1 is to create a safe and competitive environment for the cadets.
 - ii) Goal 2 is to develop and expand the knowledge of cadets in order to prepare them to be successful at their units.
 - iii) Goal 3 is to produce a challenging atmosphere for the cadets to interact and build relations with other brigades in the California Cadet Corps.
- d) Objectives:
 - No cadets injured during the event; cadets will learn to place weapon safety in the highest regard.
 - ii) Cadets will develop a sense of camaraderie within in their respective units.

- e) Application Process: Commandants should submit their Intent to Participate at www.cacadets.org/Events/Marksmanship. Commandants will register teams upon arrival.
- f) Cost: There will be no cost associated with this event.
- g) Key Suspense Dates:
 - i) As soon as Possible (ASAP): Convey possible intent to participate via email to Operations@cacadets.org
 - ii) 10 January 2022: Intent to Participate submitted to Operations.
 - iii) 21 January 2022: Rosters Due: All cadet teams rosters submitted
- h) Uniform: For cadets the uniform will be Class C. Uniform for adults will be Commandant OCP Uniform or Commandant Multipurpose Uniform.
- i) Teams will consist of four cadets
- j) In their Intent to Participate, units must designate whether fielding Senior Division or Junior Division teams (or both). No limit on number of teams a school may enter.
- k) The competition will be using .22 caliber rifles. Teams may bring their own rifles or use rifles provided by CACC..
- 1) Competition will consist of:
 - i) Senior Division: 10 rounds each fired from prone, standing and kneeling
 - ii) Junior Division: 30 rounds fired from prone supported
- m) Awards: Teams will compete for the Dion O'Sullivan Marksmanship Award.

4) **SUSTAINMENT**:

- a) Meals will be available free of charge to participants and chaperones.
- b) Transportation: Bus transportation will not be provided. School may request transportation assistance by emailing Operations@cacadets.org. Commandants must be eligible for a CalATERS account and file a travel claim to receive a rental van/SUV.
- c) Billeting: Barracks will be provided at Camp San Luis Obispo on 11 & 12 FEB. Commandants are responsible for the supervision of their cadets at all times.
- d) Ammunition will be provided. Units should travel without ammunition.
- e) Teams may bring their own equipment (i.e. slings, kneeling pads)
